

Rules for using our goods

We're excited to offer you brand new goods for your communities! **Special rules apply to the use and distribution of all Good360 donated goods.**

Corporate donors who provide these goods, rely on Good360 and its not for profit partners to uphold a commitment to high ethical and business standards.

These standards ensure that all donations are used as intended to help Australians in need and that donors' specific requirements for distribution of goods are met.

Please adhere to and share these rules with staff and volunteers:



Give the goods to people in need for free

Use the goods to facilitate your charitable purpose by giving to people in need for free or by using them to further your programs.



Goods are not for personal use by staff

Goods can not be given to or taken by your volunteers, officers, directors or employees for personal use, unless used as part of the running of the organisation. *See example 1.*



Not for resale

Goods can not be sold, traded or bartered for financial gain.

E.g. they can't be sold in op shops, garage sales, stalls or online; like eBay, gumtree or Facebook marketplace.



Goods are not for fundraising

You can not use goods to fundraise for your organisation, in silent auctions or use them as raffle prizes. *See example 2.*



Do not transfer goods without permission

The goods can not be transferred to another agency, school, branch or NFP without permission from Good360. *See example 3.*



Store goods at your organisation

You must ensure the goods are stored at a business location of your organisation and not a personal residence.

Note, that if any of these rules are violated the breach will be investigated by the Good360 Compliance Team and repercussions may include permanent termination of Good360 membership.

Example 1:

Your staff and volunteers can use stationery from Good360 in your office since that helps them do their job. However, your staff and volunteers should not take toys or makeup products for their own use. These should go directly to the individuals in need that your organisation supports.

Example 2:

You receive tablecloths from Good360. You can use tablecloths to cover the tables at your fundraising event, but you can't auction or include the tablecloths themselves in a raffle to raise money at that event.

Example 3:

You accidentally ordered more goods than your community requires and you're not sure what to do with them or want to pass them onto another not-for-profit or school. Please don't on-distribute without checking with us first! Good360 can assist you with rehoming any surplus and/or give written permission for on-distribution on a case by case basis. If you have a network of organisations you regularly give to, then chat with us about becoming a Community Redistribution Partner.
